Industry Highlights


The Mining, Oil and Gas Industry includes surface and underground mining of various minerals, as well as onshore and offshore oil and gas exploration, development and production.

Between 2017 and 2021, annual average employment* increased by 15.9%, from 8,200 to 9,500 in the industry.


