Between 2019 and 2023, annual average employment* increased by 0.5%, from 19,400 to 19,500 in the industry.




Since 2019, slips, trips and falls have decreased



Lost-time Incidence Rate/100 Employees






Soft Tissue Incidence Rate/100 Employees
