The Mining, Oil and Gas Industry captures surface and underground mining of various minerals, as well as onshore and offshore oil and gas exploration, development and production.


Between 2018 and 2022, annual average employment* increased by 35.2%, from 8,800 to 11,900 in the industry.










Soft Tissue Incidence Rate/100 Employees
