

Health and Safety Awareness Survey



Since 2017, WorkplaceNL has been using the Health and Safety Awareness Survey to measure awareness of health and safety in workplaces in Newfoundland and Labrador. As of 2021, the survey will be completed every two years.

The survey is conducted by *Newfoundland and Labrador Statistics Agency* and surveys workers over 14 years of age to assess their awareness of health and safety. The worker survey captures three important aspects of health and safety awareness:

Knowledge about workers' rights, roles, and responsibilities in the workplace.

Participation in decisions that impact workers' health and safety while at work.

Empowerment to act if a worker encounters an unsafe act or condition at work.

The survey identifies two age groups to survey:

15-24 (Young Workers)

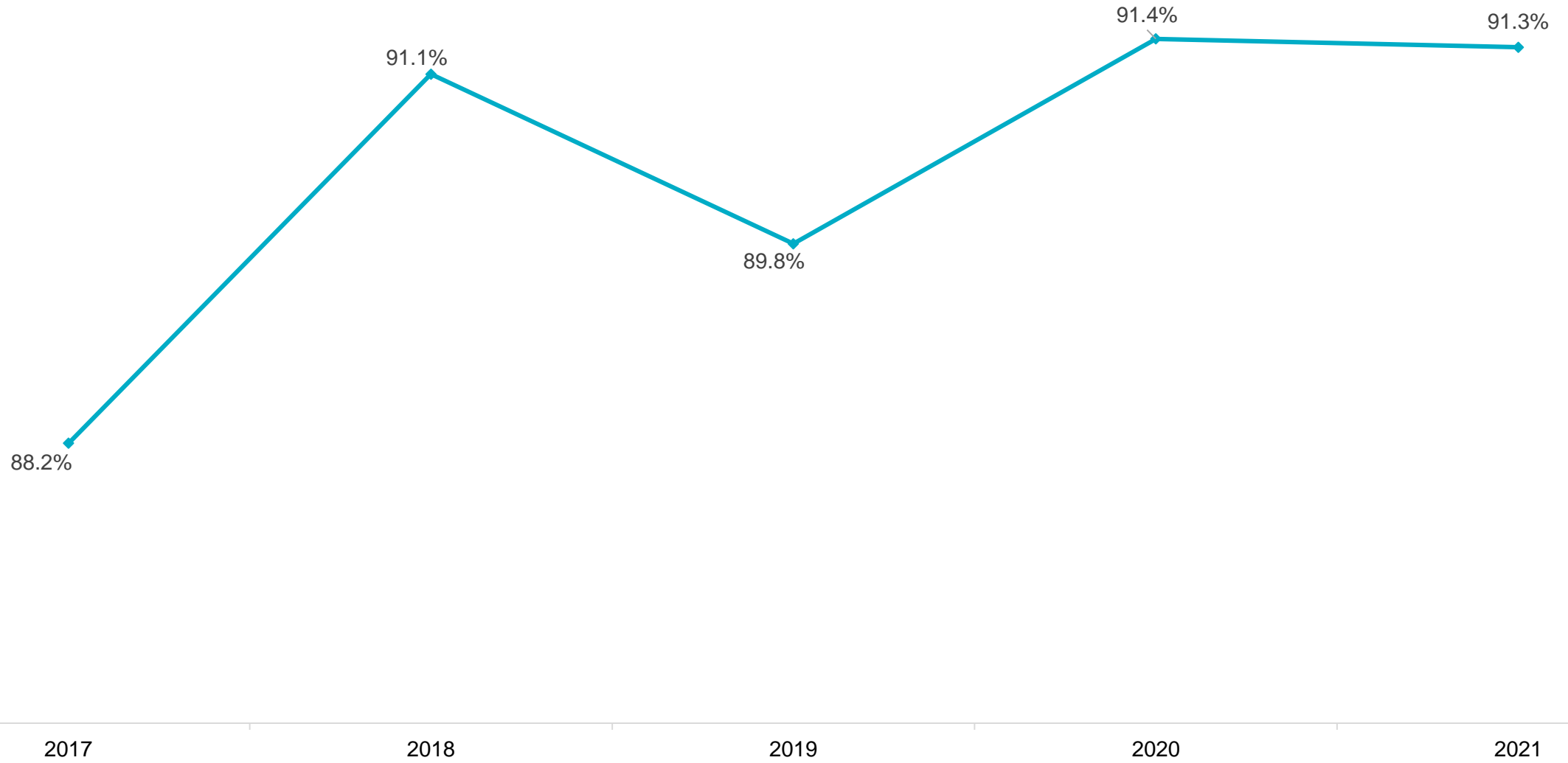
25+

In both groups, supervisors are identified in order to gauge their level of awareness

The Health and Safety Awareness Index is an indicator of the level of awareness of health and safety in the workplace.

It is calculated based on responses to select questions from the Health and Safety Awareness Survey. There are a total of 18 questions taken from Knowledge, Awareness and Empowerment categories and scored to produce an index value.
